•**RCIA:** If interested in becoming Catholic, call the church office.



To observe the Feast of Divine Mercy, you should:

- 2. Sincerely repent of all our sins.**
- 3. Place our complete trust in Jesus.**
- 4. Go to Confession, preferably before that Sunday (required if in serious sin).**
- 5. Receive Holy Communion on the day of the Feast.**
- 6. Venerate the Image of the Divine Mercy.**
- 7. Be merciful to others, through our actions, words, and prayers on their behalf.**
